Staffing Changes for 2026

As mentioned late last year, Penelope O'Brien returns to our school as our Italian teacher. We welcome Penelope back to our community after being away for 12 months. The remainder of our staff continue in similar positions, the most significant changes being Genevieve Arnold taking on the main teacher role in Year 2 with Renae Pankhurst assisting one day a week in Year 2. Renae Pankhurst (Years 1-3) and Nicola Burns (4-6) are taking on a Maths Extension program across our school for one day a week each which will be another opportunity for the most capable students in each class to be challenged.

Swimming Lesson Preparation

Thank you to all the parents for returning the swimming notes at short notice as we plan to be as prepared as we can be for the swimming lessons starting on Monday, 9 February. The swimming lesson times will be:

12:30pm – 1:10pm – Years 2 and 6

1:15pm – 1:55pm – Years 1, 4 and 5

2pm – 2:40pm – Pre-Primary and Year 3

The classes will be departing from school 20 minutes before the lesson is scheduled to start and returning approximately 20 minutes after the lesson is scheduled to finish. For that reason, our Pre-Primary and Year 3 classes will generally be back at school at or just after bell time and will be instructed to go home in their bathers. I suggest the Year 3 parents park in our carpark as opposed to joining the “pick up line” with no guarantee that the children will be ready to go home at their normal time.

Lumen Christi College and Good Shepherd Sibling Discount Program

As we begin the new school year, I am pleased to officially announce a sibling discount program between ourselves and our neighbouring Catholic secondary school. Please see the information below, prepared for us by our school Finance Officer, Jenny Marion-Clark.

Lumen Christi College and Good Shepherd have commenced a sibling discount program between our two schools.

A family may be eligible for this discount where a student is enrolled at Lumen Christi and a sibling is enrolled at

Good Shepherd.

*A completed **Sibling Discount Application Form** must be submitted to Jenny Marion-Clark by Wednesday, 11 February 2026, and will then be validated by Lumen Christi. Forms are available from our school office.*

*The sibling discount applies to **tuition fees only** and is calculated as follows:*

- **Second child:** 20% discount
- **Third child:** 40% discount
- **Fourth and subsequent children:** 100% discount

Concession Card Discounts

Families who have a current Concession Card may also be eligible for discounted school fees.

Please bring your Concession Card to the office and complete the required form by Friday, 11 February 2026.

Parent Information Evening

Preparation for School Swimming Carnivals – we are starting to prepare a plan for the 3 school swimming carnivals for the children from Years 1-6 at Good Shepherd on Friday, 27 February:

With most schools now back over the past few days, many families are settling into the reality of early mornings, busy afternoons, and full school schedules again. Whether your child has just started school for the first time or returned to a familiar classroom, this transition period can still take time to adjust to — for kids and parents.

Support the Reset Back Into School Routine

Children of all ages benefit from knowing what to expect. Checking in, reinforcing routines, and giving a little extra support in these first weeks can help reduce stress and build confidence for the term ahead.

Try this:

Now that school has started, focus on reinforcing the routine at home:

- Talk about how mornings and afternoons are feeling — what's working well and what feels rushed or stressful.
- Keep bedtimes and wake-up times consistent.

- For younger kids, keep practising independence skills like packing bags and remembering school items.
- For older kids, support them to manage their schedule, homework planning, and organisation. You could do this by keeping a family calendar on the fridge or wall.
- Keep communication open — sometimes kids only process the change once they're back in the school environment.

ERideables

Our School is committed to ensuring that our students are empowered to travel to and from school safely. We recognise that eRideable devices such as eScooters and eBikes are a popular mode of transport accessible to many within our School community.

Equally, our School recognises that eRideables are subject to legislation that prohibit a child under the age of 16 from utilising these devices. Therefore, from Monday, 2 February 2026, students who are under 16 years of age will not be permitted to use or store an eRideable device on school premises.

Examples of eRideables include but are not limited to:


- eScooters
