Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It is always great to see the children slip into the new routines for the start of the new school year, particularly those children moving to a different building. I think the biggest transition is for our Pre-Primary children transitioning up to Year 1 and to a lesser extent, the Year 2 children moving up to Year 3 in Ward House. I think the smooth transition reflects the consistent approach to managing the children across the school.

Swimming lessons add to the variables as we start 2024 as well, but they too seem to have started pretty smoothly. Thanks to the parents for their support with the swimming lessons. I have no doubt it adds another variable in the household as the children are prepared for school each day.

The Lent Season

As Catholic people, we reflect on the Lent season as the most important time of the year, the liturgical season consisting of 40 days of fasting, prayer and reflection. This season begins with Ash Wednesday today and concludes at sundown on Holy Thursday as we celebrate the Easter season. Our school (Years 1-6) travelled to the Church for our Ash Wednesday Mass this morning which was a lovely opportunity for the children to present their Lenten promises, which signifies the start of the Lent season. It was lovely to see so many parents with us at the Church.

On-Line Safety Presentation

One of our parents, Larissa Simpson has extended an invitation to all parents in our community to attend an "On-Line Safety Presentation" designed for parents of 3-12 year old children. The free presentation is facilitated by Communicare and takes place on-line on Tuesday 19 March from 6pm – 7:30pm. The flyer promoting this presentation is in this edition of the newsletter.

Last week we were alerted to a Fathering Project activity (which I have just noticed clashes with the online presentation mentioned above) in our local community at the Armadale Aquatic Centre. Thank you to those parents who attended the Parent Information Evening last night, I hope you found it informative. With a little under 50% of the parents attending, it was disappointing that we did not have a bigger turn out. We will survey the community to see if there is a better format or timing of this important night which may encourage more parents to attend. Each class teacher has prepared some paper work for each family, so my suggestion would be for all families in the school to ensure they get a copy of the plans/processes for the respective classes of their child/ren.

P&F News

We have our first P&F Meeting scheduled for Tuesday 20 February at 6pm in the staffroom. Please come along and contribute to planning the 2024 school year from a P&F perspective.

Some information regarding the P&F Nature Play was shared with the parents who attended the Community AGM towards the end of last year and again last night in a little more detail at the Parent Information Evening. This is a big project, but one which will have a significantly positive impact on the outdoor space for our children in the main playing area of our school for the benefit of the children in Years 1-6.

Our P&F Nature Play sub-committee – Danica Smith, Dylan Teicher, Fred Pilot and Clary Powell will be meeting with myself tomorrow afternoon to put together a plan for the installation of the new play space. It will be an exciting project for the community.

School Swimming Carnival

Looking ahead, our children will be able to put their swimming skills to the test on Friday 1 March for the school swimming carnival at St Brigid's College, Lesmurdie. Again, we will split the school into 2 groups for 3 separate carnivals – Years 1 and 2 in the shallow pool early in the day and the children in Years 3-6 split between the 25M pool in a separate carnival to the less confident swimmers in Years 3-6 who will also be in the shallow pool. More details will follow over the next week or two.
