Dear Parents and Caregivers,

A huge thank you to everyone in our community who has contributed to a number of events that have taken place here at Good Shepherd, with the 2 highlights being the Mother's Day Stall last Friday morning and the School Cross Country Carnival last Friday afternoon. We enjoy a really strong sense of community within our school, thanks to everyone who contribute towards that!

Winter Uniform Transition

Thank you to all families who have ensured their children have transitioned so smoothly into the winter uniform over the last week or so. The weather continues to be quite unpredictable and unseasonably warm but all children are asked to persevere with the winter uniform between now and the end of Term 3.

Cross Country Carnival

We enjoyed a great community event on the oval last Friday afternoon, the School Cross Country Carnival. As I described to the children on the day, this event has the reputation of being the most gruelling event on our sporting calendar. I thought our children across the school acquitted themselves really well and the results across the board were very pleasing, congratulations to all concerned but particularly to the first, second, third and fourth placegetters in each race, who will represent our school at the upcoming Interschool Cross Country Carnival (Years 3-6) here at Good Shepherd on Friday, 24 May. The only variation to the names below may be if a student was unable to attend the School carnival for unforeseen circumstances, in that case, they would be considered for the Interschool carnival.

As you can see from the results below, it was a keenly contested event, particularly in the Year 3-6 carnival where the difference in team scores from second place to fourth place was only separated by 2 points. Once the younger children's races were included, the final results spread out a little more, as you can see below.
