Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We have enjoyed many highlights in our school community over the past fortnight including our recent whole school mass to celebrate All Saints Day, the Year 6 Camp and the P&F Colour Run last Friday. We have lots of things to celebrate in our Good Shepherd community.

Year 6 Camp

We enjoyed a great time away with the class group on the Year 6 camp. The children participated fully in a large range of challenging activities throughout the four days and all achieved a significant degree of success along the way. I recall reflecting on the camp with the class on the Monday following the camp, and the children listed 18 different activities that they had enjoyed, which highlights just how busy it was for the four days we were away. As we discussed prior to camp, the key to a successful camp is getting an appropriate amount of sleep to allow us to recover from the busy days. We ticked that off as a success, with the children all getting 6-7 hours sleep each night, which put them in a good position to tackle the following day's activities with the energy and endeavour required to be successful.

Congratulations to all the children who contributed so positively towards their camp experience and enormous thanks to Renee Guazzelli, Diana Newman and Sarah Cooper for everything they did to support the children throughout the four days, and also to Brent Johnson who assisted on the first day of camp. It was a really valuable experience for the children.

All Saints Day Mass/Commissioning Altar Servers

Last Wednesday was All Saints Day, an important day for all Catholic people as we reflect on and pay homage to all the saints in our Church who have contributed so much to our Church and provided examples and role models for others to aspire to. Following the celebration of the Eucharist, we were also able to commission seven new altar servers from Year 4 and 5 as part of the Mass, which was a great achievement by the children who have committed to being trained and willing to serve our community by assisting Fr Pavol during Masses. P&F Colour Run

What an awesome event last Friday afternoon coordinated by our Year 1 class reps – Nicola Teicher and Leonie Handgraaf. The children had a wonderful time and the community got right behind the event by attracting sponsors and raising a huge amount of money which will go directly towards the Nature Play space we are designing for the playground area adjacent to the amphitheatre near the shade sails between Ward House and the basketball courts. Money continues to come in this week, but we have already collected over \$8,000 which is a wonderful community effort which the children will reap the benefits of through a more extensive Nature Playspace. The landscape architect has been back at our school today to share the progress made with the concept drawing.

Academic Assessments

It is this time of the year that we need to carry out clinical assessments of the different cohorts of children across the school to tangibly identify the level of progress made. This information will be analysed and measured along with a number of other data collection methods including the School Climate survey and recent School Review process to pinpoint specific areas of focus for us as a school community to ensure we continue to develop all aspects of student development to achieve the best outcomes for the children. As a leadership team, we will be spending the day at CEWA tomorrow with a range of educational consultants formulating our plan for the next 12 months, which will be shared with parents at a couple of upcoming forums – our community AGM and the Parent Information evening at the start of next year.



Cost;



If you are currently moving through the waves of grief, it's crucial to acknowledge your own grief and give yourself permission to go through that rollercoaster of feelings. We know it's not easy, but it's important.

If you're on the other side - supporting someone in their grief, remember that sometimes, just being there is the most significant thing you can do! Your presence speaks volumes and can provide comfort like nothing else.

So, as we move through the week, let's remember to be kind to ourselves and those around us. Grief may be tough, but we're tougher when we face it together.

Top Tips

1. Be there. Don't shy away or avoid the person and their loss.

3. Involve them. Although it can difficult to attend social activities during this time, it's important to involve them whenever possible to ensure they are staying connected and getting out of the house.


