Thank you to all parents for taking advantage of the opportunity to meet with teachers at the formal Parent-Teacher meeting organised back on the afternoon of Tuesday, 4 April. It is always important for parents and teachers to work towards building a positive rapport with their child/ren's teachers as families and school staff working together for what is

in the best interests of the children and these meeting go a long way towards building this positive relationship. It is also a good forum for staff to share some clinical information about how children are progressing after settling into the new routines and procedures since the 2023 school year started. Parents are encouraged to initiate conversation with school staff if they require information or support regarding the progress of their child/ren.

#### **Sacramental Celebrations in Term 2**

Term 2 is always a special time in our community when our sacramental programs come to fruition as our:

- · Year 3 children receive the sacrament of Reconciliation on Friday, 16 June
- · Year 4 children receive the sacrament of First Communion Sunday, 11 June
- · Year 6 children receive the sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, 27 May

These are very special occasions in our community and significant liturgical milestones in the lives of the children and their families. We look forward to coming together as a community to celebrate these occasions.

#### **ANZAC Reflection**

Yesterday, being ANZAC Day, is always a very special and proud day in our calendar as respectful people who take the opportunity to show our gratitude towards the many people who have fought to protect our country and those who are currently on peacekeeping duties. We had a short but meaningful reflection at school this morning to ensure we provide the chance for our children at Good Shepherd to continue to develop their understanding and appreciation for what has gone before us to enable us to enjoy the quality of life we do here in Australia.

## **Kindy Enrolment Interviews for 2024**

I will be completing the Kindy Enrolment Interviews for 2024 over the first month of Term 2, so if any families have children born between 1/7/2019 and 30/6/2020 please ensure you have completed your application form and we will contact you for an interview. As well

as looking towards next year as far as our Kindy 2024 cohort is concerned, I am also looking at the potential to start a Pre-Kindy program all day on Thursdays for the second half of 2023. This question will be asked at the Kindy interviews and hopefully we will be in a position to reignite the Pre-Kindy program at Good Shepherd, Kelmscott. If any of our school families have extended family or friends who may be interested in Kindy, 2024 or even Pre-Kindy in the second half of this year, please encourage them to complete an application form and submit it to our school office.

## **Spending P&F Money in 2023**

There has been some conversation with the P&F during Term 1 about our plans to allocate some money from the P&F towards a project to benefit the children at our school. We have come up with 3 potential projects that the money could go towards. Over the next week or two, a survey will be sent out to our community providing an opportunity for each family to provide their thoughts on the best way to spend this money for the benefit of the children. I will confirm the final wording of the survey with the P&F at our first meeting for Term 2 on Wednesday, 3 May, before the survey is sent out. Please come along and be part of the conversation if you can. The meeting will start at 6pm and will be held in the staffroom.

#### **Cross Country Season**

Term 2 is accompanied by the Cross Country season. We have the perfect natural environment at our school to develop our cross country running skills and this began a couple of weeks before the end of Term 1. We will continue preparing the children for our School Cross Country Carnival on Friday, 12 May and the Interschool Cross Country Carnival will be hosted by our school again on Friday, 19 May.

More details will follow but what I can confirm is:

**Friday, 12 May** - School Cross country carnival will begin at 12noon with the Pre-Primary, Year 1's and Year 2's races taking place on the school oval between 12noon and 12:40pm before we break for the normal lunch break. Following the lunch break, the Year 3-6 races will take place around the school cross country track, starting with the Year 3's and concluding with the Year 6's, finishing before 3pm.

**Friday, 19 May** – Interschool Cross Country Carnival is a morning event for the Year 3-6's and is usually finished by 12:30pm, starting with the Year 3's and concluding with the Year 6's.

#### **School Climate survey**

Our school community will be notified in the middle of May about a School Climate survey which provides the key stakeholders in our community with the opportunity to provide some feedback about the management of our school. This is a process which is undertaken every 2 years under the direction of CEWA as we continually look for ways to refine our processes as we aspire to manage the best school community we can for primary school aged children and their families. More information will be forwarded as the date approaches.





# The Important Role of Father Figures and Male Role Models

A father figure can be any positive male role model in a child's life. They can be sports coaches, teachers, uncles, grandparents or even your child's friend's dad

As kids grow into teenagers, it might feel like they aren't talking to you as much and might focus more on their friends.

But that doesn't mean they don't want to talk to you at all!

It's important to keep checking in and having conversations with them regularly. Asking for their opinions and listening to their ideas shows that you respect them as they mature.

If you often find it difficult to connect, talking while doing something together, like driving or cooking, can

be a good way to have a casual conversation. It's less intimidating than sitting face-to-face and can make it easier for them to open up.

## **Top Tips**

- **1. Be open and available.** Let your children know you want to talk with them regardless of the topic. Always show them that you enjoy talking with them.
- **2. Stay up to date** with what's going on in their life on a daily basis.
- **3.Talk about things that interest them.** To get the conversation going, ask them about something they are interested in (sport, music, a video game, a movie or series they have watched).
