Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It is amazing to think that we are in the final fortnight of the first term. It has continued to be a very unpredictable landscape which has required a strong level of agility to adapt to the changes at very short notice. The community here at Good Shepherd has been fantastic at adapting to the different challenges placed upon us and continuing to maintain the strongest level of normality possible for the children.

### **Harmony Day Focus**

Last Wednesday in our community was a beautiful day for everyone to focus on their own cultural background and celebrate the differences across our school. It was great to see the children proudly wearing clothes that reflect their family heritage and enjoying some conversation with class members about the cultural background of their family. The highlight of the day for the children was a Harmony Day reflection held in each classroom celebrating diversity among people in the world and the positive impact it has on us in our community here at Good Shepherd.

**Replacement Priest – Monsignor Tim Corcoran**

We welcomed Monsignor Tim Corcoran into our school community last Thursday, he spent some time with our Year 4 students. Monsignor Tim or another visiting priest will be returning this Thursday as well and will continue to visit our school and work with our students while Fr Pavol is unable to come into our community. The focus for visiting priests will be with the older students at our school and their preparation for Easter.

### **Stations of the Cross**

Speaking of preparation for Easter, our school community will be participating in a Stations of the Cross reflection on Wednesday, 6 April. We will not be able to include parents and grandparents in this Easter reflection unfortunately in the current COVID climate. This is always a special part of the lead up to Easter, simulating and developing the children's understanding of the path Jesus walked prior to being crucified on the cross on Good Friday.

### **Parent – Teacher interviews**

Unfortunately, we are not able to facilitate Parent-Teacher interviews in its traditional format at the conclusion of Term 1. Teachers have been asked to contact parents individually, via email initially, some in the last couple of weeks of Term 1 and others in the first couple of weeks of Term 2, to potentially have either a phone conversation or an online meeting to discuss your child's progress. A significant number of parent-meetings have already taken place since the start of the year, so there may not be the need for another conversation at the moment. Parents are encouraged, at any time, to initiate conversation with teachers via email to discuss their child's progress.

### **Sacramental Program preparation**

As far as our Year 3, 4 and 6 children receiving their respective sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation is concerned, our aim is to work towards the planned dates for these celebrations:

**Confirmation** – Retreat Day on Friday, 3 June and Mass on Saturday, 4 June at 6pm

**Holy Communion** – Retreat Day on Friday, 17 June and Mass on Sunday, 19 June at 10am.

**Reconciliation** – Retreat Day and Sacrament on Friday, 24 June

However, in the current climate, we felt it was appropriate to delay the preparation meetings until early next term, in case the dates need to be pushed back. We are conscious of not having an extended period of time between the preparation meetings and the children receiving the Sacraments. I ask the parents of children in the Year 3, 4 and 6 cohorts to look out updated information as the COVID restrictions continue to evolve over the coming weeks.

### **Swimming Update**

The proposed Interschool Swimming carnival scheduled for Friday, 1 April has been cancelled as the result of a significant number of schools choosing not to attend, due to the current COVID situation across WA.

We have also locked in Friday, 4 November for our second school swimming carnival day at St Brigid's College to provide more exposure to a competitive swimming environment, particularly considering that a significant number of children did not attend our original carnival day a few weeks ago. Please put this date in your diary as we aim for a successful day in our school community. It will involve children from Years 1-6.

We have also asked Kristy Maher to cover Nicola Burns' role on Thursdays and Fridays in Year 5 for the remainder of the year and look forward to Kristy's contributions in Year 5.

### **Parent and Caregiver Correspondence: CEWA Self-Reporting Portal for COVID-19**

It is vitally important that parents and caregivers inform the school if their child tests positive for COVID-19.

To support our planning for your child's classroom attendance, please continue to notify Good Shepherd, Kelmscott, if your child returns a negative PCR/ RAT result, after:

- being identified as a close contact (Day 1 test to return to school as an asymptomatic close contact), and/or
- being identified as a household close contact (Day 7 test to conclude quarantine).

To help streamline this process a [COVID-19 Self-reporting Form for Students and Staff members](#) has been developed by Catholic Education WA (CEWA). Parents and caregivers can now inform the school of their child's positive or negative COVID result via this [LINK](#). The information will go directly to the Principal, prompting our COVID response.

The link will also be available on the Good Shepherd, Kelmscott website.

Please do not underestimate the importance of informing Good Shepherd, Kelmscott of a positive COVID case. Your actions will ensure the risk to others is minimised and that we do our very best to limit the spread of the virus across our community.
