Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to school from Term 2, I hope everyone had an enjoyable break from school routines and a wonderful Easter with family and friends. We had beautiful weather over the school holiday break topped off with some much-needed rain in the last couple of days.

For the start of Term 2, we welcome Beau (Year 4) and Hayley (Year 2) Molson back to GSK after spending 12 months or so up north and we also welcome Imella Boyo, a new student into our Pre-Primary class.

COVID Update

As you would have heard, The Minister for Health, Amber Jade-Sanderson announced yesterday that public health measures in Western Australia will be eased to what is now being called, "baseline settings", effective from Friday, 29 April.

Our plan is to maintain the same COVID guidelines for the first week of Term 2, I will be meeting on-line with all the Principals across our system on Friday morning in preparation for providing the updated COVID protocols to all families by the end of this week, in preparation for week 2, Term 2. This continues to be a continually evolving space and we will continue to keep families informed of changes when they arise.

Arrival time at school

A reminder to all families that staff begin supervising children outside the classrooms from 8:15am with the classrooms opening at 8:30am. There is a small degree of leniency after 8am, as long as the children remain seated outside the classroom adjacent to the shade sail area between the STEM room and Ward House. Any students arriving at school before 8am will need to be booked into the Camp Australia out of school care program. Thank you for your support.

Parent - Teacher Interviews

We were notified at the end of Term 1 that we can recommence face-to-face parent-teacher meeting from the beginning of Term 2. I would encourage any parents who have not caught up with their child's class teacher to ensure they do so as we move towards the formal reporting period at the end of Term 2.

Good Shepherd Feast Day

On Friday, 6 May, we will be celebrating Good Shepherd Feast Day, starting with a whole school Mass at Good Shepherd Church 9.30am. The Mother's Day stall (thanks to the P&F) will be incorporated into the time between recess and lunch on the day, as well as the children enjoying some time with their buddy classes. After lunch, the children from PP-6 will be participating in a tabloid sports afternoon to round off the festivities on the day.

NAPLAN

Term 2 is our NAPLAN term for the children in Years 3 and 5. The testing will begin on Tuesday, 10 May and the final assessment is scheduled for Monday, 16 May, allowing a couple of days for "catch ups" if children are away. Can I ask all parents to ensure their children are at school if at all possible during this NAPLAN assessment period by avoiding any appointments, if possible.

School Cross Country carnival

Our school cross country carnival has been scheduled for Tuesday, 17 May. Our broad plan is for the children in PP-2 to participate in a "race" around the oval from 12noon to 12:40pm. The children from Years 3-6 will participate in separate year level and boy/girl races around our cross country track starting with the Year

3's from 1:15pm, working our way up to the Year 6's later in the afternoon prior to the 3pm bell. Come and join us if you are able to, we are hoping to have a great afternoon out on the oval with the children.

As far as our Year 3, 4 and 6 children receiving their respective sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation is concerned, we have now confirmed the planned dates for these celebrations:

Reconciliation – Parent Information Evening Wednesday, 1 June 6pm @Parish centre Retreat Day and Sacrament on Friday, 24 June
