Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Good Shepherd has continued to be a busy place as we provide a broad range of activities for the children in our care, many of these activities go beyond the classroom based teaching and learning which engages the majority of the children's attention at school. Some of these other activities recently have included: sacramental programs, winter sports activities, tree planting, the Lifelink launch and the upcoming school disco.

Sacramental Celebrations

We have had 2 wonderful sacramental celebrations in our community over the last few weeks. Our Catholic faith is the cornerstone of the building of school culture here at Good Shepherd and sacramental celebrations are times when our children reach significant liturgical milestones along their journey of being young Catholic people. We were privileged to have Bishop Sproxton in our community back on Saturday, 18 May to confirm a number of young people in our Good Shepherd parish. It was a very special occasion for the children and their families.

Our Holy Communion celebration last Sunday was also a beautiful occasion for so many families in our community. To look around the Church and see so many different people in our community contributing to make it such a special occasion was wonderful to see. We had a number of Year 4, 5 and 6 children providing the singing to support Diana Newman, Year 5 children altar serving, and a significant number of staff members present to support the children and staff directly involved and the parish catechists who do such a good job preparing the catechist children. It really is a team effort and a great celebration for the Good Shepherd community, underpinning what we stand for.

Staff Professional Development

Last Tuesday, 4 June, our staff joined the staff at 3 other Catholic schools – St Maria Goretti, Redcliffe, St Jude's, Langford and Matthew Gibney, High Wycombe to commence the Berry Street Education model course. It was the first day of a 4 day program which will be completed over a 2 year period, designed to develop the staff's understanding of the importance of emotional well-being and some strategies to enhance emotional well-being as a contributing factor towards academic success.

Networking with St Jude's, Langford

I have recently initiated a professional opportunity for our staff to meet with the staff at St Jude's, Langford for a curriculum meeting once a term after school. A number of the dynamics within the two school communities are quite similar including our current academic focuses so an opportunity for staff to engage with a different group of people in professional dialogue will have some positive benefits for our school community.

Semester Reports

The staff are currently finalising their grades and comments for the Semester 1 reports which will provide a formal summary of the development and progress demonstrated by each child at our school (K-6) since the start of the 2024 school year. The reports will be distributed electronically and in hard copy form, please spend time with your child/ren commending them on the progress they have made and identify a couple of areas of focus on for the coming semester. Our hope is to distribute the semester reports on Wednesday, 26 June, two days before the end of the semester.

P&F Update

We had a very productive P&F Meeting last night with some of the key items discussed listed below:

- Congratulations to one of our parents, Dylan Teicher who won an award last Friday evening at the Catholic School Parents of Western Australia (CSPWA) awards evening for an award of "Excellence" in the parent category. Dylan's nomination was one of 13 nominations in this section from across our system. This reflects a nomination put forward by the P&F executive at GSK demonstrating all the contributions Dylan has made to our community here at Good Shepherd. Thanks and congratulations to Dylan! (see below).
- Nature Play update we have confirmed the 3 major items to be professionally installed over the coming weeks. We have also devised a plan to build some log bridges which will go across the creek bed and "line" the perimeter of the nature play area with other logs collected from our property from marri trees that have died as a result of the extreme summer we have recently experienced.
- The details are being finalised for the upcoming P&F Disco this Friday night, the children are looking forward to it.


